

## Curriculum Vitae

Omran Algriany was born on November 17<sup>th</sup> 1966 in Soukna, Libya, he studied veterinary medicine at the Veterinary Faculty in Tripoli, Al-Fateh University, Libya and was awarded a Degree of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) in 1990. Shortly after his graduation, he began work as a demonstrator at the same faculty, and after having completed two year national service, in 1996, he started his three year Master degree study at the lab of reproductive biology, Szent Istvan University, Godollo, Hungary. After graduation he began work as assistant lecturer at the Department of Physiology and Biochemistry at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Al-Fateh University.
