## 1. Introduction

In 1989 Koert van der Horst published a work on the illuminated and decorated medieval manuscripts in the collection of the University Library of Utrecht, in which he depicts 741 images of 181 different medieval manuscripts, most of which originate from Utrecht.<sup>1</sup> Together with a basic analysis of the manuscripts and classification of the illumination and decoration, this catered for a detailed overview of the most important medieval manuscripts in the collection from an art historian's point of view.

Since 1989 the University Library of Utrecht has acquired a number of medieval illuminated and decorated manuscripts, which made an addition to Van der Horst's work desirable. Research on manuscript fragments and maculature has also revealed a number of illuminated and decorated manuscript leaves which deserve to be included. In 2011 a project was started to provide for a supplement on Van der Horst's *Illuminated and decorated medieval manuscripts in the university library, Utrecht*, which was to be carried out by students in a traineeship at the University Library of Utrecht. Since each traineeship lasted about two months, it was not possible to cover all the loose manuscript fragments and maculature still bound in books. Hence a series of three volumes has been planned, to be published as pdfs on the website of Special Collections of the University Library of Utrecht.

The present volume covers all the manuscripts acquired after 1989, and a selection of loose manuscript fragments.<sup>2</sup> The second and third volumes will cover the remaining loose manuscript fragments and maculature still bound in books. Although illuminated and decorated manuscript fragments and maculature are often difficult to analyse, and the decoration itself may be damaged, we still think it necessary to include them, if only for the sake of completeness. As a selection criteria, we have followed the guidelines provided by Van der Horst, and we present the additional illuminated and decorated manuscripts and manuscript fragments here in almost the same way as Van der Horst did in his work. means that the selection does not include manuscripts dated after 1550 and that we have used Van der Horst's way of classifying the decorations and illuminations, which is as follows:

A – Miniatures.

A'- Drawings related to the text, such as tombstones, surgical instruments, ground plans, etc.

B – Historiated initials with an illustration relating to the text.

B'- Historiated initial with an illustration unrelated to the text, such as human figures (grotesque or otherwise), fabulous animals, etc. Exceptions are initials with dragons executed in penwork, which occur particularly frequently in Utrecht manuscripts. These initials are catalogued under categories E-H.

C – Marginal scenes related to the text, including coats of arms.

D – Border decorations. The occurrence of drolleries within this category is stated at all times, the most important being described.

E – Elaborated and/or painted decorated initials, with pen-flourishes in the margin.

F – Decorated initials, with pen-flourishes in the margin.

G – Elaborated and/or painted decorated initials.

H – Decorated initials.

I – Miscellaneous, e.g. drawings on paste-downs, inserted engravings and woodcuts, etc.

This system of classification is used when describing the manuscripts and their illuminations and decorations. As in Van der Horst's work, we have chosen to give all the manuscript descriptions before we present the plates, but we do so separately for the bound manuscripts and the loose fragments. The descriptions consist of the following elements:

- The catalogue number for this work, the name or number ascribed to the manuscript in the University Library Utrecht,<sup>3</sup> and the numbers for the plates as presented below.
- The name or title of the text of the manuscript, if possible with the name of the original author, and the language used.
- Approximations of place or date of origin.

- Information on the structure of the manuscript: writing material, number of leaves, measurements of the leaves followed by the measurements of the writing area, and finally, if more than one, the number of columns. If there is a medieval or modern foliation or pagination in the fragments, this has been noted. Otherwise one folio is numbered fol. 1, a bifolium or several leaves of one manuscript A, B, C, etc., in the order as they would have appeared in the original manuscript.
- *Scribe*
- *Script* in which the manuscript is written (possibly more than one).
- *Binding*
- *Provenance*: all known successive owners of each work.
- *Artist*
- *Decoration*. Here we discuss the illuminations and decorations of the manuscript, classified by numbers A - I as given above, and where possible with the relating Iconclass numbers, which are used by Van der Horst to facilitate further research.
- *Literature*. Here we give specific references we have used while working on this manuscript. A list of sources which we have used in general for almost each manuscript is given in the bibliography.
- *Note*: other noteworthy features.

In completing this catalogue we would like to express our thanks to the keeper of the manuscripts of the University Library Utrecht dr. Bart Jaski, who helped us on many occasions during our research. It is because of his efforts that we were able to conduct this research in our traineeship at the University Library Utrecht.

The descriptions and plates of the manuscripts are presented below in order of their artistic/historical value and elaboration. The first section entails the bound manuscripts acquired between 1989 en 2011<sup>4</sup> and the second section entails the loose fragments (first section).






