

Foreword

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We are happy to present a new volume of *Linguistics in the Netherlands*, a collection of internationally peer-reviewed articles presenting current linguistic research. This volume is based on the 53rd annual conference of the Linguistics Society of the Netherlands (AVT), convened on February 4, 2022. This meeting was the second in a row that took place online, due to restrictions in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The conference featured 51 contributions in 6 parallel tracks. A duo keynote held by Dr. Jacomine Nortier (Utrecht University) and Dr. Gerrit-Jan Kootstra (Radboud University) was dedicated to the life and work of Pieter Muysken, who we sadly lost last year. This was a wonderful tribute to one of our most treasured linguists, who we miss dearly.

Following the conference we received 19 submissions, of which we were able to accept 14 for publication in the present volume (with four more being invited to resubmit for the next volume). The volume also contains three papers presented at the 2021 conference. We thank the 45 reviewers who were able to provide us with their expert judgements in a timely manner. Just like last year, we are happy to report that all empirical and experimental contributions to this volume contain a link to materials, data, and/or analysis code available online, in support of our commitment to open and durable science.

Besides a sustainable science, we are also committed to a sustainable environment. For this reason, AVT members will no longer automatically receive a printed copy of *Linguistics in the Netherlands*, but only on request.
